

## Guidelines for preparing abstracts for the ÖMG-DMV-Conference 2013

This is a guideline for preparing an abstract for the ÖMG-DMV-Conference 2013 in Innsbruck. Such an abstract should be typeset in L<sup>A</sup>T<sub>E</sub>X [1, 2] using the style file `oemgdmv2013.sty` where the three basic macros `\title`, `\author` and `\maketitle` are defined. The macro `\title{title of abstract}` is used to specify the title of the abstract and the macro `\author{name}{affiliation}` to specify the name and as a second argument the affiliation of the author. Then these two macros have to be followed by `\maketitle`. Optionally it is possible to mention one or more co-authors calling the macro `\coauthor{name}{affiliation}` for each co-author before `\maketitle`. In this case the name of the author defined by `\author` is marked by a \* indicating that he/she will present the talk. When it is necessary to give references, please use the `thebibliography` environment which uses here a smaller font to save space.

As example of an abstract according to the above guidelines please download the file `oemgdmv2013.tex` which is the source of this pdf file and can be used as a template for writing your own abstract. The total size of the abstract is preferred to be less than a half of DIN A5 page according to the format defined in `oemgdmv2013.sty` and **should by no means exceed one page**.
